The Big Walk We are walking to Cincinnati!



The interns and colleagues at DFN Project SEARCH D&G are into the 4th week of our charity walking challenge. We are attempting to walk the distance from Cargen Tower, Dumfries to Project SEARCH HQ in Cincinnati, Ohio before the end of March 2021.

The walk is over 3,700 miles and will see everyone of us (12 interns, 3 staff) walk 500,000 steps each to achieve the target.

So far we have totalled over THREE MILLION Steps and walked 1,298 Miles, which means we have walked the distance from Cargen Towers to Getafe, Spain. Massive Team effort.


We are continuing to raise funds supporting both DGRI ICU department and the Calside Primary Sensory Garden and Playground.
